Abstract

"Science City: How Father Lafont Brought Pop Science to Kolkata"

This won't be merely an introductory recap of Lafont's biography that one can find many places online, but based on Jeffrey Stanley's own research which aims to separate fact from folklore. Legendary Belgian Jesuit Father and St. Xavier's founding faculty Eugene Lafont was not only J.C. Bose's professor and lifelong friend and colleague, he was also instrumental in bringing pop science to Kolkata. Lafont inadvertently helped give birth to India's record industry as well as, perhaps, its film industry. The lecture is a detective story of sorts, tracing Stanley's journey to learn about the connection between Lafont and pioneer Bengali filmmaker Hiralal Sen.
